



## SCFP Medical Student Leadership Award

The **SCFP Medical Student Leadership Award** recognizes the leadership abilities of one outstanding medical student in their final year of study at the University of Saskatchewan.

### Eligibility criteria:

Medical students in the graduating class at the time of nomination are eligible.

Nominees should have demonstrated an interest and skills in areas such as health policy/economics; government/media relations; and/or advocacy and representation on behalf of patients, their peers, or health care organizations.

Nominees should have demonstrated a commitment to or an interest in a career in family practice.

### Documentation:

- A completed nomination form.
- A single page cover letter, in the form of a brief essay, which outlines why the nominee should be considered for the award.
- At least two reference letters (one from a Family Physician) which should include sufficient information on the candidate's skills as a leader to support the nomination.
- A brief CV with evidence of:
  - Leadership activities/attributes
  - Academic achievements
  - Other special achievements/attributes
  - Non-medical interests/community activities
  - Other relevant information

### Selection process:

The Director of Undergraduate Family Medicine will solicit nominations from the fourth-year class. The Undergraduate Education Committee in the DAFM will then select the recipient and recommend to the SCFP Awards Committee. The SCFP Awards Committee will review the nomination for the award and recommend a recipient to the SCFP board.

### Value and terms:

The SCFP Medical Student Leadership Award will support attendance to the Family Medicine Forum (FMF) and travel costs of up to \$1,700. An expense claim form with receipts must be submitted.

### Nomination process:

Final nomination must be submitted online or by e-mail to [scfp@sk-cfpc.ca](mailto:scfp@sk-cfpc.ca). The deadline for nominations is **March 31<sup>st</sup> 2026**.

### Recognition of support:
